## 1. Lead with the future

Whenever possible, focus first on what will or may happen.

### Emulate:

#### **'Act of war'**

Terrorists strike; death toll 'horrendous'

To guide your readers into any “tell me a story” lead sentence, head with the future if you can.

### Emulate:

**Verdict expected** soon on toxic air aboard jets

Three Alaska Airlines managers conducted an extraordinary experiment on an MD-80 jet in 1996. Frustrated by complaints about noxious mists on MD-80 flights, the managers tried to recreate the problem on a jet parked inside a hangar.

### Emulate:

**Karzai Is Said to Doubt West Can Defeat Taliban**  
Former Officials Say Afghan Leader **Seeks Deal** With Militants and Pakistan

Two senior Afghan officials were showing President Hamid Karzai the evidence of the spectacular rocket attack on a nationwide peace conference earlier this month when Mr. Karzai told them that he believed the Taliban were not responsible.

## 2. But prefer **present** tense!

**Present tense + a future time usually = future sense.**

### **Improve:**

The new hours, he **said**, **were** the first step toward the mandatory reservation system that **will go** into effect in January and that museum officials **said** will allow them to spread out visitors during the day.

### **Emulate:**

A new law, which **goes** into effect in January, **requires** American citizens to carry passports for all Caribbean destinations except Puerto Rico and the United States Virgin Islands . . . “In Puerto Rico, the vibe is open and cool, but there is still a genuine local bohemian tradition,” **says** Edmund Castillo, the designer for Sergio Rossi, who was born and raised on the island.

### **Emulate:**

Today, Microsoft Chairman Bill Gates **comes** to Washington to participate in a panel at the White House and to meet with members of Congress.

**Present tense often combines present and future.**

**Improve:**

Thirty states and the District of Columbia **have banned** the practice [texting while driving], but the laws **are** difficult to enforce.

**Improve:**

Nobody knows much about Santana Moss, and that includes the Jets. They **have been hoping and waiting**, but nobody knows how effective he can be.

**Improve:**

After the storms, the Legislature passed a constitutional amendment consolidating many of the New Orleans-area boards into just two regional boards. The law **required** that members, who are appointed by the governor, have expertise in fields like engineering, hydrology, geology and law.

**Emulate:**

Under the 2002 McCain-Feingold campaign finance law, groups wanting to broadcast advertisements that name federal candidates within 60 days before a general election, or 30 days before a primary, **are** required to follow strict rules on how they pay for them. The law **requires** that donors be disclosed and **caps** contributions to prevent secretive groups from advocating for or against candidates in thinly disguised advertisements known as issue ads.

Choose strong verbs: present tense, active voice, avoiding weak nouns.

**Improve:**

Simplification of the story will be effected by us tomorrow.

**Emulate:**

We simplify the story tomorrow.

**But emulate these uses of passive voice:**

**Actor nonexistent:** Joe DiMaggio's 56-game hitting streak has yet to **be equaled**.

**Actor irrelevant:** The summons **was served**.

**"Equal writes":** Tell any doctor your symptoms, and you'll **be advised**.

### 3. Report to ‘you’—your reader

**Emulate:**

Rescue Plan’s Basic Mystery: What’s All This Stuff Worth?

What would **you** pay, sight unseen, for a house that nobody wants, on a hard-luck street where no houses are selling? That question is easy compared to the one confronting the Treasury Department as Washington works toward a vast bailout of financial institutions.

## 4. Be **consistent**—avoid elegant variation

### **Improve:**

The Environmental Protection Agency said Thursday that BP **has to** choose an alternative dispersant by today and **must** begin using it by Sunday.

Black federal **employees** are nearly 2½ times more likely to be fired than white **workers** in the government, a study scheduled for release today shows.

At 8, the 39th Annual Emmy Awards includes salutes to **the late** Jackie Gleason and Fred Astaire.

**Emulate:**

In a national campaign that started running over the weekend and relies on computer-altered film clips from the “I Love Lucy” series of the 1950’s, the Mertzes (**the late actors** Vivian Vance and William Frawley) squabble about a Medicare subscription drug plan offered by PacifiCare, a California insurer seeking customers nationwide.

**Improve—but how?**

**Stem Cell Side Shows**

. . . An embryo is allowed to grow to eight cells, then **one cell is** plucked out and the remaining **seven** allowed to go on and develop.

**Do vary your words to vary your meaning.**

**Improve:**

U.S. airline traffic **dropped** 10.2 percent in February, with traffic on international routes **plummeting** 26.8 percent. The pattern was repeated on the other side of the Atlantic, where British Airways watched its business **drop** 30 percent.

**Improve:**

As caseloads for the all the programs have **soared**, so have costs. The federal price tag for Medicaid has **jumped** 36% in two years, to \$273 billion. Jobless benefits have **soared** from \$43 billion to \$160 billion. The food stamps program has **risen** 80%, to \$70 billion. Welfare is **up** 24%, to \$22 billion.

**Improve:**

The **unemployment rate in Wisconsin** is nearly two percentage points below the nation's and **where President Obama won** by 14 percentage points two years ago.

This year, state Democrats are struggling to hang onto the governor's seat that Jim Doyle is **leaving after eight years** and a congressional seat that retiring Rep. Dave Obey has **occupied since 1969**.
